We've had a fun-filled run up to the Christmas break this year.

I'm sure you will join me in thanking all the staff for the hard work this term and for the opportunities they have helped provide for the children. **Make £5.00 Grow:** Year 6 have been taking part in the "Make £5.00 Grow" scheme with Virgin Money. Starting with just £5, Year 6 pupils had to design and make their own products to go on sale at their own Christmas Fayre which took place last week. The event itself was a roaring success and the Year 6 children really showcased a wide-range of skills: teamwork, budgeting and creativity. We are pleased to say that the children collectively raised a £221.90 profit, which will go towards St. Oswald's Hospice charity!

**Attendance:** Our attendance this week is 92.38%, which is an increase from last week. Our year-to-date is now 94.72%.


