Remembrance: On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November, the school took part in an assembly to mark Remembrance Day. The focus of the assembly was around the significance of the poppy and what they represent at this time; an illustrated book 'Alive with Poppies' by Tomos Roberts was shared to help explain the reasons behind this symbol. The two-minute silence was impeccable and it was lovely to include a recording of a past pupil – Ankit – playing the Last Post. I must thank members of the school council, who have been actively selling poppies and other items around school to help raise funds for this worthwhile charity.
