#### **Maths**

- Sing number rhymes and read stories, rote count and count objects, play
  counting games and build counting into everyday routines, playing cards
  games such as snap.
- Use small numbers to manage the learning environment.
- Encourage children in their own ways of recording (for example) how many balls they managed to throw through the hoop.
- Distribute items evenly.
- Match, sort and compare.
- Measure in size, mass and capacity.
- Explore patterns with varying rules.

#### **Understanding the World**

- To talk about their friends, their families and why they are important.

#### Personal Social and **Emotions Development**

- To be able to get to know each other during class discussions.
- To be able to play independently.
- To listen to each other, share and cooperate.
- To talk about choices they make and help them understand that this may mean that they cannot do something else.
- To play cooperatively with other children.
- To manage personal hygiene washing hands after going to the toilet, flushing the toilet etc.
- To go on trips to interesting places like a local museum, theatre or place of worship.

#### **Communication and Language**

- Play games which involve listening for a signal, such as Simon Says, and use Ready, steady...go!
- Use opportunities to stop and listen carefully for environmental sounds, and talk about sounds you can hear using words such as long, short, high, low.
- Encourage opportunities for conversations between small groups of children.
- Engage in role-play and imaginary play scenarios and model listening.
- Children to listen to their friends and take turns in play and activities.

#### **Physical Development**

- To be able to put on and remove my coat independently and be able to use the zips on this.
- To change into waterproofs, wellingtons to dress/ undress independently.
- To develop my pencil grip and control through dough disco and other malleable based activities such as tweezers.
- To develop my scissor skills through a range of adult led and independent activities
- To be able to feed myself independently at snack and lunch time.

#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

#### Drawing/ Painting

- To draw from their imagination and observation.
- To explore colour and how colours can be changed.
- Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings.
- Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.

#### Sculpture/ Collage

- Can use natural materials found in their outside environment to create a 3D transient 'movable art' self-portrait.
- Being imaginative.

#### Music/ Drama

Enjoys joining in with moving, dancing and ring games.
