with Sharon. While she was in school, Sharon explained to the children all about her role in the government and how she became an MP. After having a chat with our councillors, she answered questions from the children before taking a group picture.

It was interesting to speak to Sharon and hear about her responsibilities and about the work she has done with the Prime Minister.
