They have worked so hard across the year and achieved some excellent SAT results (above national data) that they should be proud of. School Patrol Crossing: This week, I'm sure many of you will have noticed, the new School Crossing Patrol Officer (Donna) has started. Certainly a welcome presence on the road, I'm sure you'll agree! I look forward to Donna continuing her role in the next academic year.

Attendance: This week our attendance is 86.38%. Our attendance for the 2024/25 academic year ended at 93.48%.

Today we had a raffle for families around attendance. Pupils were entered into draws based on their overall percentage attendance this term. Jackson M-B (4BK) won the draw for 100% attendance – winning a family pass to Adventure Valley and vouchers for Hollywood Bowl, Alex S (1MT) won the 96%+ attendance and Scarlett G (TH) won the draw for improved attendance this term – both winning vouchers for Hollywood Bowl. Attendance will be a continued key focus for our school nest year, and we will be looking to work with all families to help us achieve the 96% target.


