Dear Parents and Carers,

The final day of half-term has arrived, but what a busy week we have had around school.

**Parents' Evenings:** Thank you to everyone who managed to attend the two evenings in school this week. I hope you found it useful and informative to look at your child's books and speak to the teacher about their progress. As a school, we will continue our open-door policy, and if you ever need to speak to a teacher, this may be possible either at the start or end of the school day. However, if this is not convenient, then a meeting can be arranged by contacting the school office. Miss. Keogh's Wednesday appointments and Mrs. Parker's appointments will be arranged after half-term – I can only apologise that these were unable to go ahead.

**Year 3 Assembly:** On Tuesday, the year three children were so pleased to show all the facts they have been finding out about the Romans and how they have influenced our lives today. We were so impressed with their reading and pronunciation of some very difficult words! One of the highlights was the singing of Roman songs, especially adding sign language for the chorus. Our year three children would have made excellent Roman soldiers as they followed the commands perfectly under the strict supervision of Oliver! Thank you to all that attended.

**Forest School:** This week, year 5 had a great day in the forest area. They had fun trying to cross the wobbly slack line, build warm nests and shelter for owls, create nature art (including drawing using charcoal made from the fire) and, of course, they practiced their climbing skills too! Alongside their activities was the opportunity to make a tasty quesadilla, which was heated over the fire.

**English Hub:** We had a visitor in from English Hub this week to observe and support our work around phonics in Early Years and KS1. She was very impressed with the standard of all the pupils, and how they are becoming more confident and fluent with the phases since she last visited the school. Thanks to all staff, parents and pupils who have worked to improve phonics.

**Attendance:** This week our attendance is 93.88%, and our running total since the start of the term is now 93.92%. Unfortunately, this is still significantly below the government attendance targets, as the expectation of all schools is to have attendance of 96%+. The class with the highest attendance in key stage 1 was 1AP and in key stage 2 it was 6PP. These classes will be rewarded with an additional break time next week.

Can I remind everyone that improving attendance is a collaboration between school and home and I would love school attendance to be over 95% by Easter, which I believe is achievable. If your child is going to be absent from school (illness or appointment) can the school office be notified, and not just via messages or the year group doors – this helps with safeguarding and accounting for all pupils daily. Family holidays during term time will remain unauthorised, and could also result in a fine. School should be notified at least 2 weeks in advance of any holidays arranged.

JFK Superstar: This week, Evie (5RN) received a star award from Cancer Research UK for her courage and bravery following her cancer diagnosis last year. This is amazing Evie! We are looking forward to seeing you in school more next half term!

**World Book Day:** This year, we will celebrate World Book Day on **Friday 7**<sup>th</sup> **March**. The theme is 'What Makes me Special?' and as a school, we will be reading 'The Most Remarkable Children I've Met – So Far!' by Clotilde Perrin. Each class will be exploring the characters from this story in detail. This is always an exciting time in school, and we can't wait to see how the children (and staff!) come dressed.

**Bedtime Stories:** On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March at 4:15pm, reception children and their parents/carers are invited to come into school to enjoy an evening of bedtime stories. This is becoming a JFK tradition and something reception children have loved in the past. Children can come back to school in their pyjamas, bring a cuddly banket to snuggle up with and watch their teachers retell a class favourite! Unfortunately, this event is for reception children only. Please can we ask that younger/older siblings do not attend.
