Message from our Chair of Governors: Hello everyone. It's been a very busy stary to the school year and it's wonderful to see all of the Children settling back into school so well. I've had my usual monthly meetings with Mr Adams where we discuss Attendance, Behaviour, Staffing and Safeguarding. These meetings are always very productive and allow me to challenge Mr Adams on some key areas which help to drive the standards everyone expects of the school. I've also been interviewed by Clennell as part of the schools Safeguarding audit. I was grilled for over an hour! However, it's really reassuring to know Safeguarding is always one of the highest priorities in school. Attendance is also a key area I have a focus on and it's good to see attendance close to 96% on average this year — always room to improve but I know through the work the teachers are doing this is increasing which is great to see. I chaired the 2nd Governors meeting of the year with a big focus on OFSTED given the school are now in the window for an inspection and I will be focussing a lot of my attention on helping the school to prepare should a visit happen this year. We are also on the countdown to Christmas and I'm excited to attend several school activities planned. Finally, it's amazing to see Miss Sheriff settling so well into school — I was part of the recruitment panel who appointed Miss Sheriff and I know she will continue to be an asset to the school. They were amazed by the talent on stage and visual elements of the production - which featured the White Witch rising up into the air. After reading and writing about the story in English, Year Four were delighted to see the story acted out on the stage. School Football Team: On Thursday night, the school football team took part in their first fixtures of the Futsal league competition.

Their first scheduled game was supposed to be against Usworth, who did not turn up. Due to this, the team played two games against George Washington, one being a league game and the other being a friendly fixture.

The league game started with JFK having the better of the chances. Early in the game, Jack R and Jude C were both denied by outstanding saves from the opposition keeper to keep the score level. George Washington did well to weather the storm, surviving chance after chance before capitalising on an error to put themselves 1-0 up. Moments later, the opposition doubled their lead with a well-placed shot finding the bottom corner of the goal. Joshua R made a number of fine saves to keep the score at 2-0 before Daniel C poked home a goal from a corner. George Washington defended well in the dying moments, the game ending 1-2 to our opponents.

Despite the results not going the way that they wanted, the team showed tremendous determination and attitudes throughout to a new type of football and rules- with this being the first time some of the players have even played futsal. Well done to everyone who took part on the night!
