What a gorgeous week we have had – I have loved seeing the pupils enjoying the warm sunshine. It's been a very busy week in school, especially with the number of wider opportunities that have been offered across the school.

World Autism Day: On Wednesday in school, we celebrated World Autism Awareness Day. The day started with all children listening to the story Leo and the Octopus, which helped them better understand the experiences of children with autism. After the story, each class participated in different activities that focused on raising awareness about autism and how to support those are autistic. It was a day filled with learning and fun! All children truly enjoyed the activities and everyone gained valuable insights into how we can be more inclusive and understanding towards individuals with autism. A special thank you goes to Miss Walker for arranging the planning and activities within school for this day.

Wetlands Centre: On Monday, year 2 went on their trip to Washington Wetlands Centre. This was linked to all the science work they have carried out around living things and their habitats. During the trip, the children went on a minibeast hunt in their forest area, pond dipping and went to visit the otters and flamingos during feeding time! The children were fantastic and represented the school brilliantly. The staff at the centre were very impressed with their listening skills and excellent questions throughout. Vocal Showcase: Our amazing year 5 singers were in full voice on Wednesday, where they took part in a showcase at Washington Arts Centre. They took part in vocal warm-up exercises and sung two songs for other primary schools in the area. We were so proud of them for standing up on stage and trying their best.

Butterfly World: On Thursday, our nursery pupils went to Butterfly World at Preston Park. We were so proud of the children for having the courage to hold the butterflies and caterpillars in their hands (the children were much braver than the nursery staff). The glorious sunshine allowed us to explore the park grounds and play on the outdoor play park. We were very impressed with the children's behaviour throughout the day, you would not think the children are only three and four years old! Thank you to the parent volunteers who joined our trip, it would not be possible to go on our nursery adventures without you.



Richmond Residential: This week, year 4 went on their first ever residential to Grinton Lodge in Richmond. They have practised and perfected some brand-new skills, such as fire lighting and clue finding when orienteering. They worked well together in team challenges before toasting marshmallows around the fire pit. 
The first game was a tough one against St Bede's. The whole team played brilliantly and managed to win 1-0 with a goal from Mason.
