Refreshments: If children are on packed lunch, they should bring in their own drink to enjoy at lunchtime (which can be a juice drink), however, if they don't bring one school are happy to provide them with water to drink. I'd also like to remind everyone children should only be bringing in water in their bottles for during the day.

Yard Equipment and Toys: Just a polite reminder that children should not play with the equipment from the yard on a morning when coming into school, or at collection time. This equipment is for the Treehouse children to use during their break times. We are also seeing an increase in children bringing little toys/teddies and fidgets from home and asking to take them out on breaks and lunchtimes. Children should not bring these items into school. If any children require a fidget for any reason, we can look to provide these – please discuss with their class teacher if required.

Attendance: This week our attendance is at 96.05%, and our running total since the start of the term is at 93.89%. Whilst our year-to-date figure is still significantly below the government attendance target of 96%+, I am pleased to see a movement in the right direction. The class with the highest attendance in key stage 1 was 1MT. Both 4BK & 5MA in key stage 2 achieved a fantastic 100%! These classes will be rewarded with an additional break time next week.


