Dear Parents and Carers,

EYFS Opening Morning: Tomorrow morning we will be hosting an EYFS open session from 10:00am – 12:00pm. This is a wonderful opportunity for parents and carers, who have children starting nursery or reception in September 2025, or have children turning 3 this academic year, to visit our EYFS provision and see all the wonderful learning that happens at JFK. Our next nursery intakes will be January 2025 and April 2025, and we still have 15-hour and 30-hour places available. If you have family or friends with children starting reception next September or have children looking for a nursery place, then please let them know we'd love to see them.
