**Parliament Week:** This week, the whole school have been learning about our government and Parliament – which supports our work around the British Value of democracy. During their lessons, pupils have debated on a range of issues, written manifestos, built a model of Parliament, and created some perspective art on the House of Commons chamber. Huge thanks must go to our Deputy Headteacher, Mrs Conner, who has organised the week across school.

**Non-uniform:** Today we held a non-uniform day, with the theme of 'Crazy Hair', where we asked for donations to help towards some of our Christmas Fayre activities. I'd like to thank everyone who donated an item – this is very much appreciated and all donations will go on our popular chocolate and bottle stalls on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> December.

**Attendance:** This week our attendance is at 94.02%, and our running total since the start of the term is at 94.25%. The expectation of all schools is to have attendance of 96%+, so we are behind government attendance targets. As a school, we need everyone's support to improve our attendance. All pupils with 96%+ and improved attendance since the start of this half-term will be entered in a prize draw at the end of the term – this means that everyone has the chance to be included in the chance to win one of the prizes.

**Football:** On Thursday evening, the school football team competed in their first round of fixtures in the Futsal league.

Their first game was against Holley Park. This match was a spectacular display of domination by JFK, who outplayed the opposition from start to finish. Lennox B was able to open the scoring in the opening minute of the game before quickly adding a second. At the back, Jenson T was brilliant at reading the game and was able to prevent the opposition from getting anywhere near our goal. Evan M worked hard up front while pressing the opposition defence well, which saw JFK win the ball in the middle of the pitch before finding Jacob L in space to make it 3-0. Moments later, Jacob L scored his second and Lennox was able to complete his hat trick with a powerful effort, which flew into the far corner. Jacob L followed this up by adding an extra two goals, finishing with 4 goals in total, as JFK sealed an amazing 7-0 victory.

The second game of the night was against Usworth Colliery, who were in good form having won their opening fixture 6-0. Once again, JFK showed a fantastic attitude and ability with and without the ball. Lennox B showcased brilliant technical ability, using quick feet to beat his defender down the line before cutting inside and firing an effort past the keeper. Jacob L had definitely put his shooting boots on for this week's games, once again being a threat in the box to double the JFK lead a couple of minutes later. Reuben H was absolutely outstanding in defence, producing a man of the match display, which included two goal line blocks to keep the lead. Henry A, eager to keep another clean sheet, was in fine form and produced a number of good saves as well as being a vocal presence throughout - alerting defenders to any potential threats. In the final moments of the game, Jude C was rewarded for his high work rate up front, sealing the 3-0 victory for JFK.

Well done to everyone who took part on Thursday and we look forward to continuing the super start in our next round of fixtures.
