Attendance: This week our attendance has dropped to 92.92%, and our running total since the start of the term is now 93.83%. Unfortunately, this is still significantly below the government attendance targets, as the expectation of all schools is to have attendance of 96%+. The class with the highest attendance in key stage 1 was **1MT** and in key stage 2 it was **5RN**. These classes will be rewarded with an additional break time next week.
