Year 4 Football: On Thursday, the year 4 football team took part in the final of the Year Four Trophy.

Their first game of the evening saw them taking on St John Boste. JFK had a brilliant first half - showcasing their technical ability as well as their brilliant team work. Jack R was able to press the opposition's defence, winning the ball back before playing it forward into space. Brooke M was able to take a touch to get it out from underneath her before firing it past the goalkeeper. Joe E, Carson S and Miles M were fantastic at the back - ensuring St John Boste's chances were kept to efforts from outside of the box. Jack H and Leo H, both making their debuts, showed fantastic attitude when they came on as they battled for every ball and did not give the opposition time to think on the ball.

The second game of the final saw the team take on Rickleton. This was a very tough game, against well drilled opponents. Both teams started off strong, battling well as well as showing a determination to move the ball forward at speed. Rickleton were able to score two quick goals, both excellent strikes from outside the box before an unfortunate own goal saw the score finish 0-3 to our opponents. Leo H must be commended for putting his body on the line, making an excellent block...with his nose!

Despite the setback from game two, JFK were determined to get back to winning ways in their final game against Biddick. This was an excellent team performance, which was the difference between the two sides. Early in the first half, Joshua R made a fantastic save to keep the scores level. Joe E was exceptional at the heart of defence, showing great composure on the ball while also winning all of his tackles to deny the oppositions attack chances. Just after half time, Joshua R was once again called upon - this time making an outstanding save. Although he saw the ball late coming through the bodies in the box, Joshua was able to dive across and tip the ball around the far post. In the final minutes of the game, two Biddick defenders tackled each other and Seth A was on hand to rifle the ball through the keepers' legs. Following the late goal, the team defended brilliantly - continuing to press and put the opposition under constant pressure until the final whistle with Brooke chasing an opponent from one side of the pitch to the other and forcing him to kick the ball out, a wonderful work ethic at the end of a hard game. The game ending in a 1-0 victory to JFK.

With three teams ending the night on six points, it came down to goal difference. Unfortunately, this meant that we just missed out on a medal, finishing in 3rd place, however, the progression from our first fixtures to the finals was astonishing and the children should be incredibly proud of themselves. Mr. Smith and Mr. Titmus most definitely are!
