Dear Parents and Carers,

Even though it has been a very short half-term, there has been lots packed into it! The pupils and staff have worked extremely hard and are all ready for their week off to recharge batteries. We had a visitor from DfE in school this week, and she was so impressed with everything she saw, but what made me burst with pride was how complementary she was of the behaviour and manners of all the children.

Year 2: On Wednesday, year 2 enjoyed a full day out in Forest school linked to their science topic of plants. They explored different plants and tasted some nettle, mint and dandelion tea. Using tools, the children also enjoyed making plant prints and dens. It was a lovely day full of fun!

Year 1 Trip to Sunderland Museum: Yesterday, Year 1 visited Sunderland Museum & Winter Gardens as part of their learning about plants. During the day, they spent time with museum staff talking about plants, before planting their own pea seeds to take home. The children took a trip down memory lane, looking at what life was like in Sunderland in the early 1900s, and even had the opportunity to view some taxidermy (stuffed animals) which they all found very exciting! School Football Team: On Thursday evening, the school football team took part in the final of the Columbia Cup at Rickleton.

The first game of the night saw the team take on Usworth Colliery. Early in the first half, Richard B was able to open the scoring with his effort rifling past the goalkeeper. JFK continued to threaten the opposition, Lucas S picked the ball up and fired a powerful shot past the keeper to double the lead. JFK showed their fantastic technical and teamworking ability for their third goal. Starting with Jenson T at left back, the team passed the ball along the defence before splitting the defence with two phenomenal passes from Adam W and Lucas S to find Lennox B, who was able to slide the ball into the far post. Deep into the second half, Joseph B took a long throw in and found Richard B, who was able to complete the 4-0 victory.

The second game of the night saw JFK take on Biddick Primary. Biddick started off the brighter of the two teams, passing the ball well but were limited to chances from outside the area - Henry A dealing with each one with ease. JFK battled all the way through the game, not giving the Biddick players any time to think on the ball. In the second half, Lennox B was able to break free of his defender and power an effort towards goal. The Biddick keeper was able to push it onto the post and watched as the ball ricocheted off the near post, all the way along the goal line before stopping against the opposite post. Evan M came on and was full of energy, pressing the Biddick defenders and was nearly rewarded for his efforts, his shot going a matter of inches wide of the post. Lennox B was once again in the thick of the action and in the last minute forced two good saves from the Biddick goalkeeper. JFK were unable to break the deadlock with the game ending 0-0. This meant that the team needed a draw in their final game to bring the trophy home.

That final game was against Rickleton, a familiar foe who the team have faced off with many times over the years. From the minute the first whistle blew, you could tell JFK were determined to get a result. Jacob L was fantastic at right back, making a number of high-quality tackles and interceptions throughout the first half as JFK settled into the game. On the stroke of half time, Lennox B saw his shot tipped over the crossbar before Lucas S had another effort go just wide of the post. Moments after half time, Henry A launched the ball out deep into the oppositions box. The defenders misread the bounce and this error allowed Lucas S to smash the ball into the top corner, giving JFK the lead. The team knew this was not the end and that they would have to focus to ensure the win. Joseph B, Lucas S, Jenson T and Jacob L won countless amounts of headers and tackles to help protect the clean sheet. In the final moments of the game, Rickleton sent in a corner, but Henry A did well to get a hand to it before it was eventually cleared away. The final whistle blew with JFK taking the 1-0 victory as well as being crowned 2025 Columbia Cup Champions!

A fantastic result for the team, who thoroughly earned this moment. We are extremely proud of all players that took part, not just in this competition but throughout the year. Their technical improvement throughout the year as well as their attitude has been outstanding and it has been a pleasure to coach such a wonderful group of footballers.

To our year 6s (Henry A, Adam W, Joseph B, Jenson T, Lucas S, Lennox B, Reuben H, Evan M, Richard B and Mason C), you have been superb to coach during your time at JFK and we wish you the very best with your footballing journeys.
