

Year 4: On Wednesday, Year 4 had a fantastic day filled with Anglo-Saxon fun when they were visited by Jarrow Hall. They added to what they had already learned in their history lessons at school, and at home while completing their projects, by taking part in a crime and punishment activity, a runes, magic and medicine activity and they even designed their own settlements. They were able to examine and even try on Anglo-Saxon artefacts and replicas to get a better idea and explore what like was like between 410 and 1066AD.
