This was part of their curriculum, visiting new places and practising their social and communication skills. They also looked at lots of animals and talked about their habitats as part of their current topic. As always, the children made us so proud and had lots of fun.



Polling Day: On Thursday, our nursery provision was used for polling day. We were very proud of how well our children adapted to the school environment. The children has lots of fun doing PE, forest school and exploring the nurture room.

Music Workshop: On Thursday, year 5 took part in a music workshop with Hannah Taylor from the Sunderland music Hub. The children took part in a vocal warm up before performing some songs from Opera North and a three-part harmony called Wish. They sang absolutely beautifully, and Hannah was very impressed with the standard of singing, especially as they are not easy songs to sing. Hannah then taught them another three-part song called Oh River, which sounded amazing echoing through the hall.

Holly R was able to beat her defender before rifling an effort into the bottom corner to give JFK the lead. Brilliant defending as a team saw the team secure the victory.



The second game of the night saw JFK take on Rickleton. This was a very close contest between two very good sides. JFK were able to break the deadlock, Amelia T showing her strength to battle off two defenders before her astonishing long-range effort from the half way line flew into the top corner. The lead did not last for long as on the stroke of half time, Rickleton were able to
