They took part in several activities, both inside the class and outside in the environment, to solve various maths puzzles and questions. Treehouse Visits: This week, all our Treehouse pupils went out for the morning to continue to develop their life skills. Our younger pupils in Hedgehog and Fox classes walked to The Galleries, bought items for a cooking activity, and then asked and paid for their own ticket to travel on public transport. Our older pupils in Squirrel class went to Seaburn Park to develop their turn-taking skills using different play equipment and challenged themselves to try new things. They showed excellent resilience and encouraged each other.
